BUS DROP AND COLLECTION POINT

- Coastal buses **only** : enter off Hay Street onto Mouritzen Way. Turn left onto Wembley Court into the carpark. Buses may remain for up to 3hrs, **only** if two car bays or less are taken
- Large buses (**↑ 30 seats**) : enter Tighe Street from Hay Street (east bound); turn right onto Price Street. Pull over where safe on Tighe or Price Streets to allow students off the bus. Buses to continue on Price Street, onto Mouritzen Way; turn right at the lights onto Hay Street (west bound) towards Selby Street. Turn right onto Selby Street and park at Matthews Netball Centre.

ARRIVAL

- 'Check in' on arrival
- **Wristband** collection for those who **do not** have photo permissions
- Peer support students are requested to collect a **yellow hi visual vest** from the ACC

EQUIPMENT

- Football boots and shin pads are **not** to be worn
- Mouthguards are optional, but not a necessity
- Schools are to bring playing bibs, which are to be worn should sport uniforms clash
- All balls, cones and goals will be provided and set up by sporting partners

FIRST AID

Students taken to the First Aid Post, must be supervised by a teacher / parent support.



RAMP ACCESS, TOILET AND VENUE FACILITIES

- Ramp access, toilets and water fountain marked on enclosed map
- Lord's Café will be open for the duration of the event
- The squash walkway has been booked for the duration of the carnival, for schools to use during their break period. This area **is not** to be used as a recreational space, but for staff and students to utilise while eating, and must be left the way in which it is found, to avoid cleaning charges.
- All booked courts (1 – 4) are accessible for wheelchair use

EVENT FORMAT

- Soccer activity session will be delivered by sporting partners pre-fixtured commencement
- Stephen Michael Foundation (SMF) will assist in the direction of schools after the carnival welcome, with teams requested to move to the court of their 1st fixtured game
- SMF will umpire / mentor all games
Note : schools may need to support with umpiring on the day, and are to ensure your peer support student(s) or teachers are equipped with a whistle(s) to do so if required
- Schools to support scoring games with provided scoresheets. Results are to be signed by both teams after a game, and provided to the umpires to return to the Carnival Manager
- Clipboards **must** remain on the allocated field
- The venues timing system will be utilised for the duration of the carnival

- These will be presented to each school during presentations – please ensure you have a student in mind and ready to collect on behalf of your school.
- The winner will be presented the Ainslie Waddell Shield.



RULES

- Games are played on established and marked futsal courts
- Games will run for 15 minutes, with **no** half time break
- There is a 5 minute change over time allocated between fixtured round games
- 6 players per team on the court at one time, which includes the goalkeeper
- **Maximum** of 2 peer students on the court at one time, unlimited substitutions
- Games commence with a kick off from the centre of the court. The decision of which team commences the game is determined by a paper, scissor, rock challenge between the two captains
- During play, once the goalkeeper has gained possession of the ball, he/she may either kick or throw the ball into play



- Indoor soccer is essentially a non-contact sport. Some minor touching where neither player involved gains an advantage may be allowed. If illegal contact occurs, a placed free kick is awarded to the disadvantaged team. Free kicks will also be awarded if a player other than a goalkeeper, handles the ball, except students in chairs, and students/staff supporting them
- Goals may be scored only from the offensive half of the court. Goals scored from the defensive half of the court will be disallowed, and a free kick awarded on the halfway line
- For free kicks, goal kicks and restarts, defenders must be a minimum of 2 metres from the ball
- A ball that goes over a sideline that is next to a wall or net, within 1m is played on
- All players, apart from the goalkeeper, are required to play both defence and attack throughout all games
- A ball hitting a wheelchair is considered to be in that person's possession and is placed in the player's lap, to be pushed out and into play
- The maximum distance **any player** can travel with the ball is **10m**

GAMES POINT SCORING

WIN : 3 points

DRAW : 2 points

LOSS : 1 point

FINALS

- Overall game points determine the ladder and finals fixtures. Should not all teams within a pool have a BYE, ladder is determined through goal differential.
- If a **Grand Final** result is a draw, the team with the highest goal differential after fixtured rounds, will determine the overall winner

PEER SUPPORT STUDENTS

- Peer support students are to **play alongside** students, supporting their skills and the game, to facilitate maximum participation from all. They provide mentoring and are **not** lead the direction of play.
- Peer support students are **not** to score, and if they do, the result will not be recorded with the opposition receiving a free kick out of goals.
