BUS DROP AND COLLECTION POINT

Buses to use marked bays, and drop students along Alderbury Street, per the site map enclosed. If small coaches are being used, entry off Perry Lakes Drive into the YMCC Clubroom carpark can be used.

ARRIVAL

- 'Check in' on arrival
- **Wristband** collection for those who **do not** have photo permissions
- Peer support students are requested to collect a **yellow hi visual vest** from the ACC

MARQUEES

Schools are advised to bring a small marquee and ground mat, and set up per enclosed map. The permanent shade structure **will not** provide shade / shelter for all attendees and is not sufficient cover in the event of inclement weather.

EQUIPMENT

- Football boots and shin pads are **not** to be worn
- Mouthguards are optional, but not a necessity
- Schools are to bring **playing bibs**, which are to be worn should sport uniforms clash
- All balls, cones and goals will be provided and set up by sporting partners



TOILET FACILITIES AND RAMP ACCESS

- Public toilet facilities
x1 male ambulant toilet, x3 urinals x1 female ambulant toilet, x4 pan toilets
x1 all gender UAT
- Two changerooms available (below is within each)
x1 2 pan toilets, x1 ambulant pan toilet

VENUE FACILITIES

- Coffee van will be on site for the duration of the venue
- Water fountain is located on the eastern side of the skate park
- Cricket centre wicket is strictly **out of bounds** and will be cornered off with witches cones.

FIRST AID

Students taken to the First Aid Post, must be supervised by a teacher / parent support.

WEATHER

Football is a winter sport, with wet, cold and or windy conditions not considered grounds for cancellation. Should the weather be deemed not safe for the event to go ahead (severe thunderstorms and or localised lightning), the ACC will contact all schools by no later than 8am on the morning of the event to advise as such.

EVENT FORMAT

- Activity session will be delivered by sporting partners pre-fixtured rounds
- Teams to assemble behind allocated number sign, where they will be collected by sporting partners, and taken to the field where they will play their first fixtured game.
- Sporting partners will coach / mentor / umpire all games
- Schools are to support scoring games with provided scoresheets. Game results are to be signed by both teams after each game, and provided to the umpires to return to the Carnival Manager
- Clipboards **must** remain on the allocated field
- There are two pools, Eagles and Swans. Ladder placings of each pool after fixture rounds, will determine the final round fixtures
- Fixtures will be displayed on the reverse of each field sign

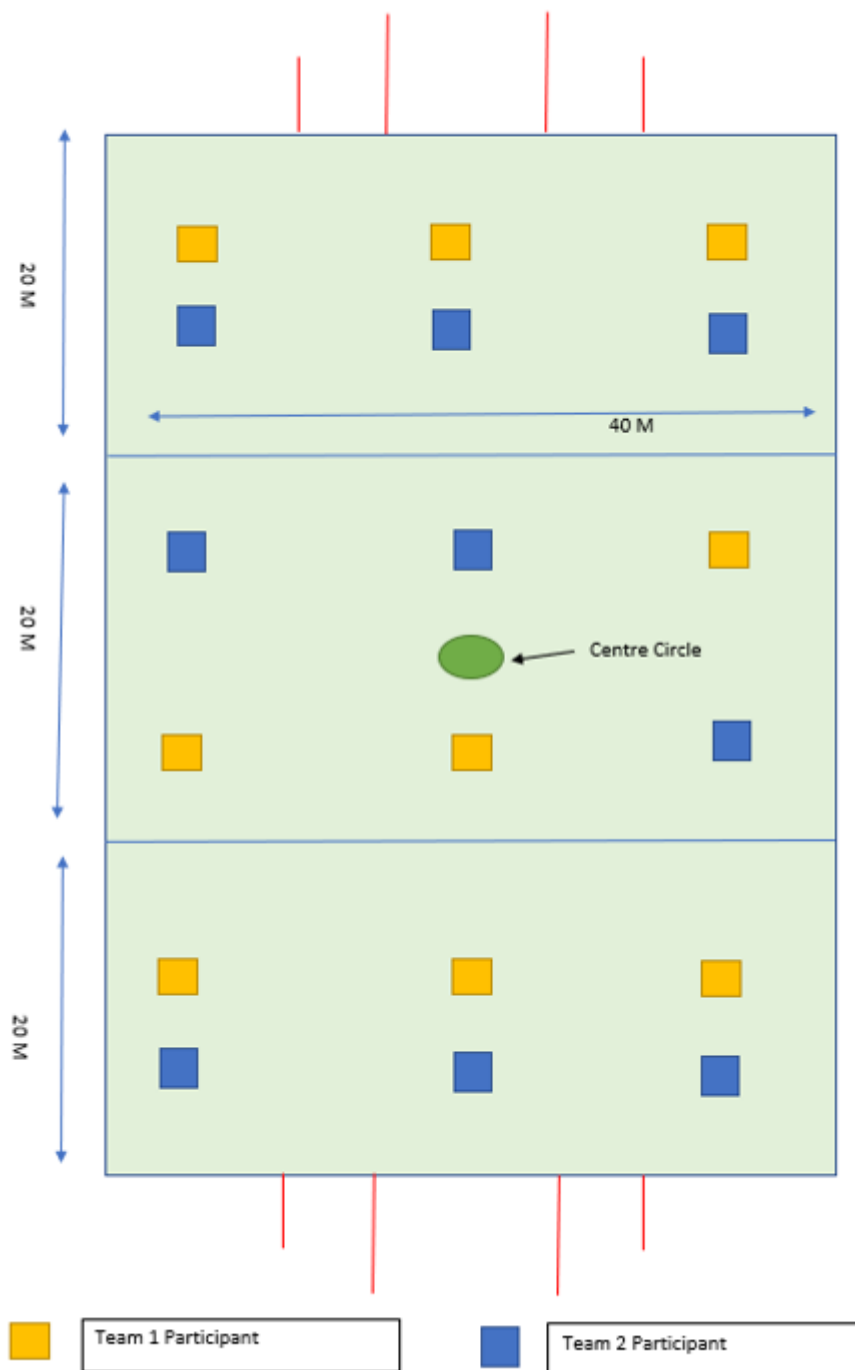

PLAYING GROUND

- Playing field is rectangular, approximately 60m (goal to goal) x 40m in width
** Field size may be modified on the day to suite the abilities of participants. **
- The field is divided into thirds, with each team fielding 3 players in each third



RULES

THE TEAM AND ZONES

- Played between two teams, each team is to consist of a minimum of 12 players, maximum of 15, with 9 players on the field
- Interchange of players may take place at any time and are unlimited in number.
- Teams are to comprise (where possible) of a combination of peer support students and students with disabilities. **Only** 3 peer support students are allowed on the field at one time
- Players are required to stay in their starting thirds; however, players may change their starting third between goals scored and the restart of play.

THE BALL

- Matches will be played with **a soft touch football**

GAME DURATION

- Games will be 15 minutes in length – it is essential teams **arrive promptly** before the commencement of all games
- There is a 10 minute changeover between each game
- A double whistle will sound **2 minutes prior** to the commencement of all games, before a horn sounds to start all games

START OF PLAY

- The game shall be started by a ball-up between two centreline players in the centre of the ground. Players must stand toe-to-toe in the ball-up (no run-up or raised knees allowed).
- The two competing players in the ball-up cannot grab the ball or take possession of it, until it has been touched by one of the centre players not involved in the ball-up.
- The centre players not involved in the ball-up must start on the defensive side of the ruckmen and not be within two metres of the ball-up. They may play the ball if the ball hits the ground.

POSSESSION (NON-CONTACT)

- An opposing player **is not permitted** to touch a player unless the player is in possession of the ball.
- A player may maintain possession of the ball within their starting zone.
- The player must release (drop) the ball when the player is touched (with either one hand or two) and or is directed to dispose of the ball by the umpire.

BALL DISPOSAL

The ball must be disposed by either a kick, handball **or** rolled along the ground.

MARK

- Knock the ball out of an opponent's hands.
- Push the player in the side, front or back.
- Steal the ball from another player.
- Deliberately bump another player.
- Smother an opponent's kick by trying to block the kicking motion at the point of impact.
- Barge, fend off or shepherd opponents.
- Touch the ball while another player has possession.

GAMES POINT SCORING

WIN : 3 points

DRAW : 2 points

LOSS : 1 point

FINALS

- Overall game points determine the ladder and finals fixtures. Where not all teams within a pool have a BYE, ladder placings are determined by average goal differential (points differential divided by number of games played)
- If a **Grand Final** result is a draw, the team with the highest goal differential after fixtured rounds, will determine the overall winner

PEER SUPPORT STUDENTS

Peer support students are :

- on field to facilitate the game, and **play alongside** students, supporting their skills and the game, to facilitate maximum participation from all. They provide mentoring and they are **not to** lead the direction of play.
- to be split across the marked thirds, and **can not** be in the same third
- **unable** to score goals or behinds. If this should occur, no score is recorded, and the opposition takes a kick out from the goal line.
