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## 1.0 General Information

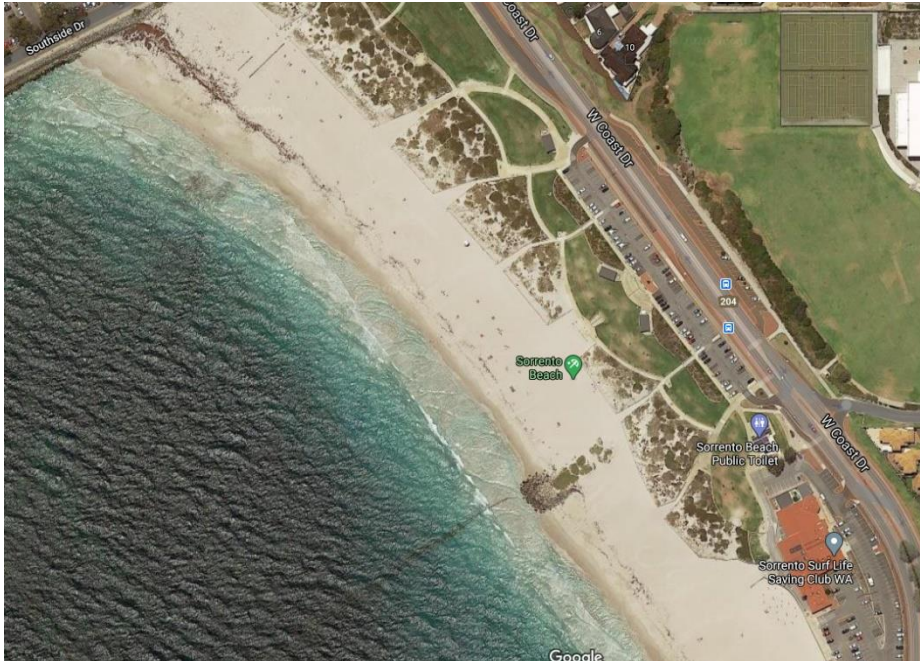
**Date:** Friday 19<sup>th</sup> February

## 2.0 Nomination of Students

Any student with a disability (years 7 to 12), whether enrolled in an Education Support unit or not, is eligible to attend.

Beach Carnival nominations are to be received by the ACC office no later than:

**Friday the 5<sup>th</sup> of February**

Late nominations will not be accepted.

Nominations are to be submitted online via the ACC website, via:

Once nomination is complete an EXCEL copy of your students should be sent through to the Inclusion and Participation Manager to confirm names, year groups and any particular grouping of students that staff wish.

Please contact the ACC office if you have any queries regarding nomination.

## 3.0 Supervision

Schools nominating students must make arrangements for adequate supervision.

Schools are to provide a minimum of 1:10 staff to student ratio (ACC General Recommendation).

Schools are to supply a minimum of 1 Surf Rescue Qualified Staff Member, who will not only be responsible for the supervision of their own school, but the supervision of all students participating in the event.

**Sorrento Surf Lifesaving Club:** Full Time Lifeguards on Beach.

Volunteer Surf Patrol for Water.

Surf Rescue Equipment.

IRB and First Aid Room availability.

**Host School Duty:** Host school to provide extra mainstream students to assist with the running of the day.

Students are to arrive early for set up of marquees on beach, flags, activity area, ironman area and markings. Host school students are to remain behind at end to clear beach area and pack away all equipment from the Sorrento Surf Club.

School supervising staff are required to assist with students needs throughout the day.

## 4.0 First Aid

Sorrento Surf Club have a fully equipped first aid room available for use, beach equipment and a full-time lifeguard.

However, it is also the school's responsibility to bring specific first aid requirements that students in their care require.

Students receiving first aid care from facility staff **must** be under the supervision of a staff member and ensure that their relevant case history and specific needs are communicated to the facility staff.

## 5.0 Spectators

Spectators are to be supervised by staff at all times and are encouraged to participate in activities on the day: however, spectators do so at their risk.

## 6.0 Shade/Shelter/Protection

Marquees provide by Sorrento Surf Club will be made available. However, schools can bring their own to ensure adequate shaded area for their students.

In the event the weather forecast for the day is extreme or inclement, the ACC Inclusion and Participation Manager will SMS all Inclusive Sports Coordinators and advise accordingly by 8:30am on the morning of the carnival.

## 7.0 Format of the Day

Schools to arrive on location by no later than 9:30am to setup and erect any marquees, shade, and provisions.

At 9:45am the ACC Inclusion and Participation Manager formally welcomes and addresses all schools in attendance and usher the participants to the starting line for the Ironman Events. A starting airhorn will sound and mark the commencement of the Ironman Event. Participants will endeavour to swim/wade and paddle 2 laps of the designated marked out course area in water and on land.

Students finishing the Ironman Event/course will receive a placing ribbon for places 1<sup>st</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> place.

At the conclusion of the Ironman Event (approx. 10:20am), students will rotate between activities in designated groups in rotations of 20 minutes.

Each school attending the day will be responsible for providing at least one activity for the group rotations, an example is:

Sacred Heart	Beach Volleyball
Etc.....	

It is the responsibility of each school to bring all of the appropriate equipment for each activity.

Pack up with the assistance of the host school will commence at 12:00pm.

A BBQ lunch for all students and teachers will be held in the Sorrento Surf Club undercover area from 12:30pm (assisted by Sacred Heart College Volunteers).
