(**Schools are encouraged to arrive 15 minutes prior for shoe distribution etc. Unless a specific arrival time is provided to you from the venue**)

Cost:

- Charges are **payable to** Zone Bowling Morley or Zone Bowling Joondalup by each school upon entry to the facility. Please ensure you have an existing account or are paying cash on arrival.
- School and student lane allocations will be organised before the day based on nominations.
- A maximum of 70 students can attend the bowling at each venue and nominations/places will be assigned on a first in basis.
- Schools can nominate students to play & pay for one game or two games, or a combination. Most years schools pay for two games, as reasonably able students will complete 1 game well within a 2 hour time frame and they should consider playing 2 games.
- Schools can select which venue they would like to attend. If a venue is full schools will be allocated to the other venue.
- Bowling lane bumpers and disabled ramps will be provided.
- Please phone Zone Bowling Morley or Joondalup for further information about the venue including food options and student requirements. Note: Each centre has varying policies in regard to consumption of foods.

3.0 Nomination of Students

The events are open to all students and are targeted at students with a disability regardless of whether they are enrolled in an education support unit or not.

Ten Pin Bowling nominations are to be received by the ACC office no later than:

Term 4 Carnival: Tuesday 1st November (Term 4)

No late nominations will be accepted.

Nominations are to be submitted online via a web form on the ACC website by completing the required information:

- Venue to attend
- Number of Games to be played
- Student names
- Year Group
- Special Needs (needs ramp etc...)

Please Note: Any special grouping requests must be noted on the nomination form

Student names **MUST** be included on the nomination form so that suitable provisions can be made.

4.0 Supervision

Schools nominating students must make arrangements for adequate supervision.

At least one staff member per 5 students is required.

School supervising staff are required to assist with bowling and scoring. Scoring is optional and at the discretion of staff supervisors.

6.0 First Aid

Injuries are to be attended to by the individual school staff. Assistance is also available from the facility staff that have a first aid kit.

Students receiving First Aid care from facility staff **must** be under the supervision of a staff member that their relevant case history and specific needs are communicated to the facility staff.

7.0 Spectators

Spectators are to be supervised by staff at all times and are to be kept well clear of the bowling lanes.

8.0 Bowling Lane allocation

Each student nominated by his or her school will be allocated to a particular bowling lane. Where possible students will bowl with and against students from other schools.

9.0 COVID-19 Safety Procedures

All students, staff, coaches, officials, and other personnel are asked to follow the COVID-19 safety rules to keep everyone safe:

Equipment

- No sharing of personal items such as water bottles, towels or clothing is permitted.

Physical Distancing

- Schools should maintain a strict limit of a minimum of 1.5 square metres (1.5sqm) per person where practicable.

Good Hygiene

- Schools to provide hand sanitisation for students.
- Schools to promote importance of personal hygiene to students; hand cleaning, no physical greeting contact (i.e., handshakes, high 5's, hugs, physical performance celebrations), no spitting, cough and sneeze covering.

If you are Feeling Unwell

- Students should report any cold or flu symptoms to a staff member if they are feeling unwell.
- People feeling unwell and showing flu/cold like symptoms will be isolated from other people and arrangements made for them to leave the venue ASAP.

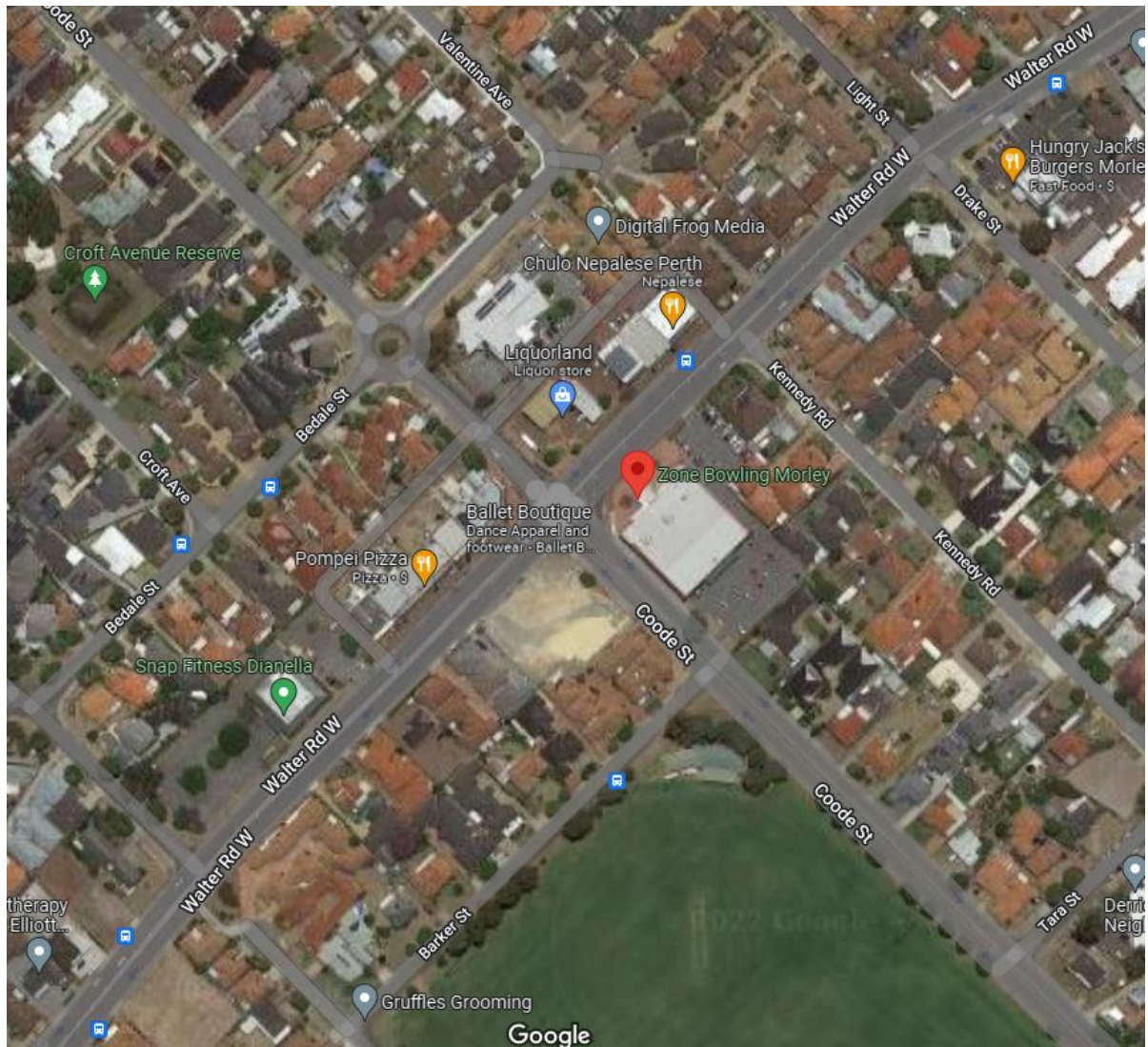
Covid Impact Statement
