CAR PARKING

P Car parking is available in the:

- car park behind the YMCC hockey clubrooms.
- temporary grass car park off Alderbury St.
- The residential areas to the east & south of Alderbury Street, in marked areas only.

No P Car parking is NOT allowed in the:

- pickup/drop off bus zones on Alderbury St and Perry Lakes Drive.
- Bold Park car parks off the west side of Perry Lakes Drive
- WA Ecology Centre and Perry House car parks off Perry Lakes Drive.
- vicinity of the skate park on Perry Lakes Drive.

MAXIMUM NUMBERS OF COMPETITORS

A maximum of 6 competitors per gender and age group may run for each school. Exceptions are made as follows:

- *Multi-Class/Inclusive runners do not count towards a team's maximum number.*

MARSHALLING

- Schools are responsible for ensuring each competitor's correctly allocated timing bib is attached to their chest before they marshal.
- In the marshalling tent competitors will walk over black Automated Marshalling Mats.
- Competitors are required to marshal 20 minutes before their race start time.

Each school must have a team liaison person with their runners for each event at the marshaling area at the correct marshalling time.

School team liaisons are to:

- ensure any competitor changes have been made with the competitor change officials in the Club Rooms.
- ensure competitors do not enter the marshalling area before their event's marshaling time (i.e. more than 20 minutes ahead of their event time).
- ensure no more than the maximum number of allowed runners for each event enter the marshalling and start line area.
- assist in positioning their competitors on the marshalling line, behind their school sign, in three (3 behind 3) with the best runners at the front.

THE START

- The Starter will call runners forward from the Marshalling Line to the Start Line.
- At the Start Line, runners are to retain their positions in threes (3 behind 3 with the best runners at the front).
- The starter's command "*take your marks*" will be followed by an air horn start signal.

THE FINISH

- Runners are not to stop on the finish line; they are to continue moving through the finish area transition chutes.
- The first three placed runners will be issued with a place card and ushered to the finish tent.

EVENT RULES

Event rules are as per IAAF cross country running rules, except where stated otherwise. The maximum number of competitors allowed per school for each event is part of the event rules.

DRESS

Competitors are to be attired in their school's athletic/cross country or physical education uniform.

- Footwear is compulsory. Spikes are not to be worn.
- Music devices, headphones/earpods are not to be worn while competing. The wearing of watches is discouraged due to possible timing bib sensitivity.
- Timing bibs must be worn and correctly fitted. It is the school's responsibility to ensure that competitors are wearing their correct bib number.

GENERAL

- RESULTS/PLACES: All runners are automatically timed and placed by the timing system when they cross the finish line.
- A competitor who does not cross the finish line unaided will not receive an official time, place or score. Runners that do not finish will be listed as DNF in the results.
- Course officials have the power to disqualify students who choose to walk the course and are without the desire or fitness to complete the course as a run. These students may be directed back to their team area without finishing.
- Competitors are permitted to compete in *one* age group only. Competitors are permitted to run in a higher age group (school year), if they compete in only one event at the carnival.
- Student participation is limited to primary school students and the minimum level for participation is enrolment in Year 3.

NB: Footballs, soccer balls, etc. are banned in all areas.
The Basketball court and Skate Park off Perry Lakes Drive are out of bounds.
Climbing of trees, hockey goals, marquees and buildings is prohibited.

TROPHIES & AWARDS

Competitors represent their school as an individual and as part of a team.

The Multi-Class/Inclusive events are separate events. Multi-Class/Inclusive competitors only score points for their school in a trophy category if they are in the top three finishers for their school and finish inside the cut off time.

Medallions are awarded for individual competitors as follows:

- 1st, 2nd and 3rd place getters in each event
- 1st place getter (not disability specific) in Inclusive events

Plaques/shields are awarded to the winning team in the following 11 categories:

Year 3 Girls	Year 4 Girls	Year 5 Girls	Year 6 Girls	Aggregate Girls	

To qualify for these 11 team awards a school must have a minimum of 3 runners who successfully complete the course within the cut-off time, in each event within the trophy category. The first three places gained by an individual school in each event, count towards these team trophies.
